Content	Zacazonapan is a municipality in the State of Mexico, it is a population that is in a process of transition from a rural to an urban population, favored by mining. It has a series of unresolved problems such as: school backwardness, poverty and social inequality, lack of access to medical care, the appearance of communicable diseases, the difficulty of detecting and controlling non-communicable diseases, inequity in population health, in addition to being a population crossed by structural violence, gender violence and drug trafficking.  The Health Promoters Training Program seeks the empowerment of the population; especially the most vulnerable, the one with the greatest difficulty in accessing medical care, seeks to train the population so that they can respond in an emergency, also so that they can make decisions that benefit their own health-disease processes. so that they also participate in health promotion plans and programs, in the detection of risk factors. In other words, returning to the communities as part of the health team.  We carried out a program of 18 sessions with a duration of 3 hours divided into 3 modules: 1) Pre-hospital care; in which knowledge is provided to respond in case of emergencies; 2) health promotion in which issues that serve to promote health are

development of skills that allow them to generate a participatory community diagnosis.
