Title	DEFINITION OF NURSING CARE IN THE OUTPATIENT SETTING FOR THE CHILD AND ADOLESCENT POPULATION DIAGNOSED WITH LEUKEMIA, BOGOTA-COLOMBIA, 2019-2020

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coping with diagnosis, quality of life, and reduction of psychosocial and emotional impact. Objective: to define nursing care in the outpatient setting for the population between the ages of 2 and 18 with a diagnosis of leukemia linked to a foundation, Bogotá-Colombia, 2019-2020. Methodology: cross-sectional quantitative descriptive study. Target population: children and adolescents between the ages of 2 and 18 with a diagnosis of leukemia (lymphoid or myeloid), linked to a foundation in Bogotá-Colombia and with ongoing treatment. The sample was non-probabilistic, due to convenience. The data was analyzed with both Excel and SPSS programs. Results: based on the social, demographic and family characteristics of children between the ages of 2 and 18 diagnosed with leukemia, nursing care was established for the outpatient setting using Dorothea Orem as a theoretical reference: for the development of self-care, autonomy, education about the disease, recognition of symptoms, alarm signs, fears and expectations; multidisciplinary interventions for proceeding in the psycho-emotional and social sphere. Conclusions: nursing care for the outpatient setting submitted contemplates psychosocial, family, spiritual, educational and support actions in the development of self-care actions; concerning the needs of the minor, it was shown that the role of the nurse is fundamental in each stage of the disease, especially those that lead to a greater predominance of symptoms or complications that affect the quality of life to a greater extent.

Background: Childhood cancer has been the focus of multiple investigations to improve

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
