Content	<p>Introduction: Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic is the defining global health crisis of our time and the greatest challenge we faced. Countries are racing to slow spread of virus by limiting travel, quarantining citizens, close schools and universities. Problem statement: One of challenges we face in Sudan is the surcease of education of medical students and powerlessness to proceed with education online in universities. Objectives: This study aims to quantify degree to which medical students profit by elearning in Sudanese universities during this pandemic. Methodology: An investigation survey was applied to medical students at different levels in various Sudanese universities, this data was gathered by process for an electronicquestionnaire that contain 13 questions. Result: Our investigation showed that 22% of students utilize their universities online platform to proceed with their education, just 25% of this average see that this technique for completing education is practical, while 75 % them trust it is futile. also, questionnaire shows greatest obstructions that students face in e-learning are poor network access 50% thought that. Likewise, students utilize e-learning to proceed with their education out of scope the universities by 68%, and 30% of them think this is helpful for them. Conclusion: In Conclusion, we have reached that most students don't proceed their education in this period, and that most of them profit by e-learning out of scope of their university's education. hence, we prescribe universities to speed-up the continuation of, we recommend telecommunication companies to help provide the needs of students.</p>
