Content	Introduction: Intersectoral collaboration is a very important process regarding health promotion, disease prevention, and multiple problem-solving. Objectives: To evaluate the Collaboration between Gezira state Ministry of Health and other organizations such as UNICEF, Gafi, and the WHO Methodology a descriptive study conducted in a period of two weeks. data collected through interviews and reports review Results: The study showed that the target category by these programs is children below 5 years old. The target number was 1,097,765. 100.6% of the target number gained benefit from this project (the target number was 1,097,765 and the number of people who gain benefit was 1,098,381). The program ensured they are fully vaccinated against polio and the increase in percentage relates to the increase in population since the target group is determined based on the population size of the past year. This program was organized by the federal ministry of health in cooperation with Gezira state ministry of health, WHO, Gafi organization, UNICEF, and other organizations like Sudani telecommunication. Activities done were vaccination campaigns, awareness campaigns, providing lectures and seminars in villages, neighborhoods, distribution of awareness posters, discussion groups, and training courses. Conclusion: The study revealed that intersectoral collaboration plays a core role in health promotion. Thus conducting a lot of projects to connect different sectors with each other for better health promotion is highly recommended.
