Content

Background- Breast Cancer is the most common malignancy in females around the world. Collectively, US, India and China account for almost one third of global breast cancer burden. This study evaluates the changing paradigm in carcinoma breast in tertiary rural centre in central India. Methods- A Prospective Observational study was conducted at Wardha, Maharashtra over 1 year.100 women suspicious of breast malignancy were identified. Their histories and clinical examinations were recorded. Mammography and Ultrasonography of breasts were used. Pathological studies (Biopsy and ER/PR) were performed. Staging was done and management strategies were instituted. Results- Commonest age of presentation is in females of 4th and 5th Decade. 70% females presented in premenopausal age group and on history 98% were having no obvious risk factors for Carcinoma breast. Commonest clinical presentation was painless lump with more affection of left breast. The commonest site of affection being the upper outer quadrant. 90% females were totally unaware regarding breast cancer screening. 73% patients presented in stage III. 95.4% cases were of ductal carcinoma. 64% cases were ER/PR/HER2 Negative.
